

INDIBA and K-Laser Animal Health International Clinical Case Competition by INDIBA, S.A.U.

1. Title: INDIBA and K-Laser Animal Health International Clinical Case Competition by INDIBA, S.A.U.

2. Who Can Participate:

Veterinary professionals who have and use K-Laser LASER and/or INDIBA radiofrequency equipment in their clinical practice for animal treatment. Clinical cases can be developed with various animal species as indicated by the categories: small animals (dogs and cats), exotic animals, equines, and other domestic mammals, such as bovines. Participation in the competition is completely free.

3. How to Participate:

Interested parties **must register on the website (link). After registration confirmation and the corresponding access link, the data collection form for the clinical case must be thoroughly completed**, ensuring to include relevant images and results. The information collected in the fields is saved and allows the form to be filled out according to the availability of information for later submission. Participants must submit the fully completed form before September 30, 2024. Additionally, the writing rules described in point 7 must be complied with.

4. Participation Limitation:

Participation in this competition is limited and subject to prize availability. The competition organizers reserve the right to close registration and/or participation once the maximum number of participants has been reached or based on the number of available prizes.

5. Prize:

Participants whose cases **are accepted**, even if not winners, will receive the e-book "VETERINARY PRACTICE MANAGEMENT 2ND EDITION" by Ignacio Mérida Isla. The participant will receive an email confirming the acceptance of their clinical case and,

subsequently, if consented, will be contacted by Editorial Asís via email to download their e-book. Additionally, a committee of experts will select the most outstanding cases to be included in an exclusive book compiling the best clinical cases. Furthermore, the first place will receive a "full pack" (registration, transport and accommodation) to participate in a veterinary conference in their region (to be defined), the second place will receive a half-pack (registration + accommodation), and the third place will receive registration to a conference of the same characteristics as the previous ones.

6. Timeline:

- July 2: Competition launch.
- July 4: Registration form launch.
- September 30: Acceptance or rejection report of submitted clinical cases.
- November 13: Final competition result.
- December 3: Notification to the competition winners.

7. Guidelines for Writing the Clinical Case:

Participants must write the clinical case and follow these formal guidelines:

- 1. Title: Must be descriptive and concise.
- 2. Summary: Include background, case presentation, diagnosis, interventions performed, and results obtained (100-200 words).
- 3. Introduction: Define the disease or medical condition, describe the relevance of the case, and present the report's objective (250-350 words).
- 4. Case Presentation (images/videos can be attached): Detail the patient's medical history, including background, clinical signs, and physical examination findings (500-600 words).
- 5. Diagnosis (images/videos can be attached): Describe the diagnostic process based on the tests performed, including clinical reasoning, differential diagnoses considered, and the final diagnosis (200-300 words).
- 6. Treatment (images/videos can be attached): Describe the interventions performed, methods used, treatment results, and patient follow-up. This section should include the K-Laser/INDIBA protocol followed, including doses in J/cm² (K-Laser), type of electrode, IAS, intensity (%), and time (INDIBA RF) (500-600 words).
- 7. Results (images/videos can be attached): Brief description of the patient's evolution and the outcome after treatment.
- 8. Discussion: Analyze the relevant aspects of the case, compare with previous cases, highlight strengths and limitations, and suggest implications for clinical practice (400-500 words).
- 9. Conclusion: Summarize the key points of the case and its importance,

offering lessons learned and possible recommendations (150-250 words).

- 10. References: Include all bibliographic sources used in the report that complement the clinical case. Example: authors, article title, journal abbreviation, publication year, volume(number): pages.
- 11. Informed Consent: Authorize the publication of the case.
- 12. Acceptance to be Contacted by G. Asís for e-book Download.

8. Terms and Rights:

- Only cases that contain all required data and meet the minimum required information according to the writing rules detailed in point 7 will be considered "acceptable."
- If the winner does not respond and cannot be contacted, another winner will be chosen.
- None of the prizes, including the e-book and the first, second, and third-place prizes, can be exchanged for their cash value.
- All rights to the content related to the campaign are the property of INDIBA, S.A.U.
- Participants consent to INDIBA, S.A.U. for the publication of the submitted clinical case, as well as the use of their name and image in promotional material related to the campaign.
- Participation in the competition implies full acceptance of these rules and submission to the possible interpretative decisions of INDIBA, S.A.U. In case of divergence in the interpretation of these rules, the Courts and Tribunals of Barcelona will be competent.

9. Data Protection Policy:
